Get Medical Assistance

Seek follow-up medical care at **ASU Health Services** by calling **480-965-3349**. Forensic exams must take place within 5 days of the incident and are conducted at Family Advocacy Centers in Maricopa County. If reporting to law enforcement, you will be asked if you'd like to have a forensic exam and they will assist with scheduling. If you would like to have an exam done without reporting to the police, call **HonorHealth Forensic Nursing Program** at **480-312-6339**.



Report the Incident

You can file a report with the **Dean of Students Office** at **deanofstudents@asu.edu** or the **Office of University Rights and Responsibilities** at **urr@asu.edu** to pursue an administrative investigation. You can also file a report with **ASU Police** (for on-campus occurrences) by calling **480-965-3456** or local police (for off-campus occurrences) to pursue a criminal justice investigation.
